We regret that we've had to cancel so many events this year due to COVID-19. We are hopeful that we will be able to make up

for it next year or once things can go back to some form of normalcy. Unfortunately we are canceling the Halloween Parade and Pizza Party. We encourage families to participate in Halloween activities to their comfort levels. While we aren't doing a structured neighborhood activity there are many ways the holiday can still be celebrated. Here are a few ways to safely trick or treat:

Tips for trick-or-treaters and parents:

- Talk with children about safety and social distancing guidelines and expectations. Keep a six-foot distance from others not in your group.
- Participate in one-way trick-or-treating and guide children to stay to the right to ensure social distancing.
- Trick or treat with people you live with.
- Avoid congregating in groups around houses.
- Wear a face mask covering both mouth and nose. (a costume mask is not a substitute for a cloth mask.)
- Do not wear a costume mask over a protective cloth mask if wearing both causes difficulty breathing. Instead, consider using a Halloween-themed cloth mask.
- Only go to houses with safety measures in place.

Tips for homeowners:

- Use duct tape to mark six-foot lines in front of home and leading to driveway/front door.
- Position a distribution table between yourself and trick-or-treaters.
- Distribute candy on a disinfected table to eliminate direct contact.

Consider handing out candy in an open space where distancing is possible, rather than from the front door.

Please remember (and remind young drivers) to drive slow through the neighborhood as there are many children out playing. We do not have sidewalks for them to play on so many take to the street to ride bikes, scooters and cars.
