COHA

The Mayor, Teresa Rich, provided details of up-coming businesses and events in Farmington Hills. The property at Orchard Lake south of 14 will have a mini Meijer, Total Wine and Nordstrom Rack. There will be a Sheetz at Middlebelt and Grand River and there will be a bourbon and cigar bar on Orchard Lake Road. The Kirk Gibson Center for Parkinson Wellness on Northwestern Highway is free and had over 900 visitors in the first three months of operation.

The Costick Center is relocating to the property of the Hawk. It is expected that through the sale of the existing land, the new Center can be built without a bond or raising taxes.

Mayor Rich will be at the Hawk to answer residents' concerns on the second Tuesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. The State of Farmington Hills address will take place on March 5, 2026 at Farmington High School. There will be a business expo and food trucks from 4:30-6:30 and the address will be from 7:00 to 9:00. The Acting City Manager, Karen Mondora spoke and reassured the members that everything is running smoothly.

Jacob Rushlow, the Director of Public Service, oversees the Engineering Department and the Department of Public Works. He talked about construction on the roads- over 300 miles. He showed a map of the projections for 2026. 12 Mile will have work done from Novi to Middlebelt. Fiber City Project

In the fall of 2023, construction began on the Farmington Area FiberCity® Project, led by SiFi Networks in partnership with the Cities of Farmington Hills and Farmington. SiFi is spearheading the effort to build an all-fiber, open-access network that will serve both cities. The Kimberley neighborhood installation is complete but many yards still have holes and bare dirt in them. The project manager from Sifi said the restoration work to repair yards will begin this spring.

Landscaping

We are looking forward to spring and a chance to bring color and vibrancy back to our entrances! Near Memorial Day we plan for planting new flowers and plants. Thanks again to all the residents of the properties at each entrance for your continued support in providing water for irrigation!
